### GENERAL RULES:

1. The FFA Show will be held from Tuesday, August 7, 2007 through Sunday, August 12, 2007.
2. All entries will be in place by 12 noon, Tuesday, August 7, 2007.
3. Market hogs will be weighed at 12 noon, Wednesday and will go to slaughter at the hour of release.
4. All FFA instructors will be expected to inform the FFA General Livestock Superintendent of the Mower County Fair Office by July 30 of the number of each kind of livestock that will be exhibited by his chapter.
5. Animals must be owned by June 1, 2007 and entered in the name of the feeder and exhibitor.
6. Birth date will be required for all events (Market steers are the exception).

7. Only animals entered in the FFA show may be housed in the Show Barn. Any FFA member grades 7-12 and until age 21 may show.

8. No pens or stalls are to be used for feed, bedding or equipment unless available after all entries are in.

9. Entry fees must be paid at the time of entry. Entry fees for 2007 swine and sheep \$2 per head; beef and dairy will be \$3 per head.

10. All FFA exhibitors must keep pens and alleys clean at all times. Failure to keep them clean may prompt Superintendents to recommend that premiums be withheld.

11. Each chapter must have necessary cleaning equipment.

12. Release time for FFA livestock will be 4:00 p.m. Sunday, August 12, 2007

13. Any Beef animal entered for competition in the FFA show may compete in the 4-H division in 2007. Exhibitors must be FFA members.

### FFA SWINE SPECIAL RULES

Judging: Friday at 4:00 p.m.

1. Entries in this division close Tuesday, August 7. Pen priorities will be assigned in the order in which the entries are received.

2. Entry fee is \$2.00 per head with three animals occupying a pen.

3. Only pigs farrowed on or after January 1, 2007 may be shown.

4. Exhibitor will be permitted to show two entries in individual class.

5. Health requirements – at the front of the book.

6. When there are fewer entries in a class than the number of premiums offered the judge may award prizes of such grade as the animal deserves. Any animal entered for competition in the FFA show may not compete in 4-H.

7. Exhibitors will be awarded their premium at release time by show superintendent.

### CLASS 1 – MARKET GILTS SPECIAL RULES

1. In the absence of a breeding gilt show, all purebred and crossbred gilts will be judged as market gilts. They must weigh a minimum of 220 pounds.

2. Exhibitors will be allowed to show two individuals. The entry fee will be \$2.00 per gilt.

3. The gilts will be divided into three classes of equal number, with weight being the determining factor. The FFA swine superintendents will divide the entries. The actual number of classes will be dependent on the number of gilts entered. If there are twenty or less, there will be one class; 21- 40, two classes; 41 or more, three classes.

4. Prize money paid for each class; Lots 1, 2 and 3, 1-\$15, 2-\$14, 3-\$13, 4-\$12, 5-\$11, 6-\$10, 7-\$9, 8-\$8, 9-\$7, 10-\$6, 11-\$5, 12-\$4, 13-\$3, 14-\$2, 15-\$1. Ribbons will be awarded for the Champion and Reserve Champion Market gilts.
